

TRANSPORT TO THE LAKESIDE POLO, ALBERT PARK

Getting to the Lakeside Polo, Albert Park, is easy. There are many transport options outlined below. The best way is to use public transport. For all train, tram or bus information visit www.metlinkmelbourne.com.au or call 131 638.

TRAIN

Catch the train into Southern Cross or Flinders Street Station then connect to the appropriate tram listed below. Remember Saturday timetables will apply, so allow for a 20-40 minute service frequency on most lines.

TRAM

Catch tram 96 from Southern Cross Station or tram 3 or 67 from Flinders Street Station. Refer to the map for other tram lines that run near Albert Park.

BUS

Some services will take you to bus stops close to Albert Park, whilst other services will take you to the city where you can catch a tram to the event. Saturday timetables will also apply, so check bus frequency.

TAXI

Catching a taxi is a great way to get to and from the event if you have a short trip from where you are coming. A taxi rank will be located on Aughtie Drive outside the event entrance.

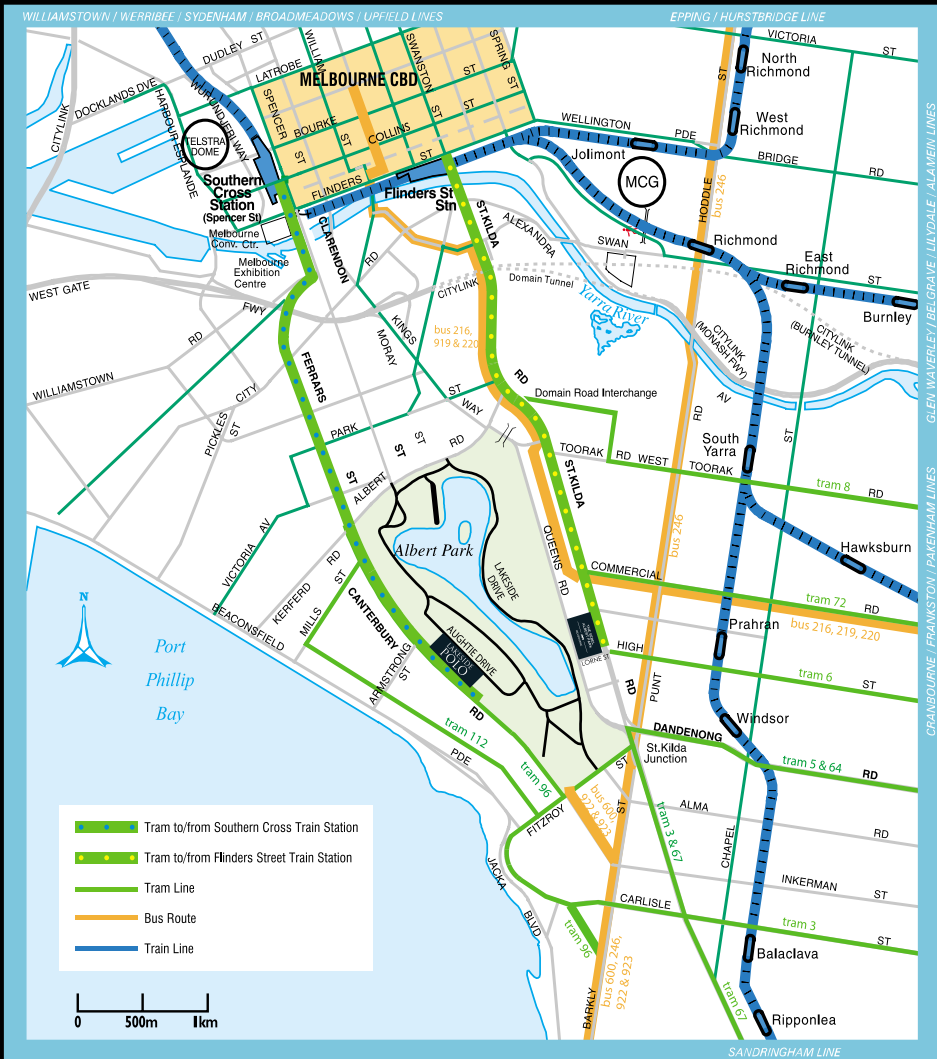
CAR

The best thing to do is leave the car at home as parking is limited and you may also be drinking. Ticketed parking is available throughout the Albert Park precinct and also at The Sebel Albert Park. All parking restrictions still apply in the surrounding residential areas.

TERMS & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY - PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

POLO IS A DANGEROUS SPORT. A HARD BALL WILL BE USED. BE CAUTIOUS OF PLAY. HORSES, ALTHOUGH TRAINED, CAN BE UNPREDICTABLE & COULD CAUSE HARM. IN NO CIRCUMSTANCES SHOULD YOU ATTEMPT TO HAVE ANY CONTACT WITH THE HORSES. DO NOT ENTER THE FIELD UNLESS SPECIFICALLY INSTRUCTED BY THE ORGANISERS.

This ticket constitutes a contract between the Event Producer and the purchaser of the ticket. Any ticket purchased and a patron's entry to and presence at the Lakeside Polo, Albert Park, means that the ticket holder agrees and accepts all the terms and conditions. 1. Tickets are not refundable or replaceable and damaged or defaced tickets will not be accepted. 2. The sale or attempted re-sale of a ticket is prohibited. 3. The promoter reserves the right to change the event format or date due to inclement weather or any other circumstance beyond the control of the organiser, where no refunds will be available. The promoter is not liable for any damage, compensation, loss, refund or expense as a result of any such change. 4. The right to refuse entry and eject patrons is reserved. 5. The event is all ages. Children under 16 years of age must be accompanied by a ticket holding parent or legal guardian at all times. ID is required to buy and consume alcohol. Purchasing alcohol for a minor is illegal. Underage drinkers, excessive drinkers, illegal drug users or patrons displaying antisocial behaviour may be ejected or dealt with by security and or police. Security and police will be in attendance. 6. The event duration is from 11 am to 7 pm, December 5, 2009. 7. The following items cannot be brought into the event: food, beverages, tents, fold out chairs, tables or glassware. Ticket holders and their property may be inspected for prohibited items on entry or during the event. Ticket holders found with prohibited items may be refused entry, ejected or have those items confiscated. Confiscated items will not be returned, replaced or reimbursed. 8. The event site is an area of Total Fire Ban. Patrons detected using flame including fires, gas bottles, flares or fireworks may be fined by the Fire Authorities and ejected from the event. 9. There is NO SMOKING inside the marquees. Smoking is however permitted in outdoor areas. Smoking in the private marquee sites is the decision of the marquee organizer where the ashtrays provided must be used and cigarette butts must be disposed of correctly. 10. Audio or visual recordings of the event without the permission of the organisers is prohibited. Still cameras may be used for private purposes only. Ticket holders consent to inclusion in official photographic, visual and audio promotion/recording of the event. 11. The ticket holder acknowledges that the sport of polo is dangerous and accidents sometime occur but will not purposely endanger or cause to endanger themselves, another ticket holder or any participant. 12. If the ticket holder suffers injury or mishap as a result of any action during the play or as a result of their own action, they agree not to seek damages from players, organisers, sponsors or anyone associated with the event.
